Central Region ABWM supports 10 special Global Servants (singles and families) and this month I would like to highlight one of these couples and how they use their gifts in very different ways.

Larry and Becky Stanton are based in Hungary but Larry extends his reach into neighboring Serbia. Here are some of their thoughts..

Recently, Larry journeyed to Serbia, his heart full and his hands ready—carrying not only tangible aid, but the deep well of compassion and generosity that you have made possible through your faithful support.

Because of your kindness, he was able to purchase vouchers for food and hygiene products, allowing families to approach Easter with a sense of dignity and joy rather than despair.

Before the aid was distributed, Larry turned to our ministry partner, Pastor Zoltán, and asked, "How many people do you think we can help with these funds?" Zoltán's reply was gentle, yet deeply stirring: "Two hundred souls." Not just people. Souls. Each one a sacred story, a beating heart held dearly in the eyes of God. Each life—priceless, irreplaceable, known.

And yet, perhaps the most powerful gift offered on this journey wasn't what was given, but what was shared. Larry spent time with men and women who so often feel like shadows in a fast-moving world-overlooked, unheard. But in those quiet moments—sitting side by side, listening without hurry, simply being—the ministry of presence came alive. It reminded us that love is not measured only in what we give, but in how we see, how we linger, how we carry Christ's gentleness into every encounter.

While Larry travels, Becky is serving as an elementary school teacher. We've found soul care in simple things, like weekly visits to the local thermal bath (a very Hungarian tradition!). I always joke, as I sink into the steaming mineral water, "Ok, I'll stay." Because yes, teaching can be that hard some weeks. But God always gives me a reason to stay.

During one such visit, surrounded by palms and warm waters, the Holy Spirit whispered something new: You're not a pine tree, tall and rigid. You're a palm tree—fun, flexible, joyful. A holiday in the midst of your students' gray days. That image has stayed with me. I'm learning to embrace it—and stay rooted in this calling.

Many kids in Southeast Asia are struggling to survive. For those who have been abandoned by their families to sleep in the streets or are dropped off at the local temple there seems to be no hope. But our Global Servants are working to find these kids and give them a home and hope. They are also given the opportunity to get an education. Sometimes that means going to school and graduating from high school. Other times that mean the opportunity to learn a trade. In a harsh world they have a chance to grow and provide for themselves. But the kids that find their way into the lives of our Global Servants are given far more than that. When they arrive in these homes they get to hear about the love of Christ and the Good News of Salvation. They also get to experience that love from their house parents and teachers. The job of the Global Servants, teachers and house parents is not an easy one, but it makes all the difference to these kids.

As we raise money for the home and school for girls in Southeast Asia let us continue to give thanks for those who choose to serve in these homes. Let us lift them up in prayer that they receive the energy they need to help these precious and hurting kids, the wisdom to direct them in this life, and most importantly the opportunities to lead kids to Christ.

#### Mission and Service

After more than 25 years of teaching, and now several years of ministry in Hungary, I'm learning to meet each student and each day with less judgment and more presence. Contemplative prayer has helped me let go of the need to control or change things—and instead accept the holy chaos of the classroom as it is. There's joy in that. And healing too.

Still, there are days I doubt myself. I wonder if all the laughter and connection I share with my students means I'm not taken seriously, or worse, not a good teacher. But Larry, my husband and steady partner in ministry, always brings me back. He reminds me I don't need to teach like anyone else—I just need to be who God made me to be.

Right now, we are at 77% of the ongoing support we need to remain in Hungary and Serbia. International Ministries requires us to be fully funded to continue serving here. If our support doesn't increase, we may be required to return to the U.S. to focus on raising funds—something that would interrupt our ministry and the deep relationships we've built.
